## CI Munro Alternative Global Growth Strategy

CI Munro Alternative Global Growth Fund (the Fund) is an absolute return, global equities fund with a core focus on growth equities. The Fund is index-agnostic, aiming for meaningful absolute returns through the investment cycle while maintaining a capital-preservation mindset. The Fund's flexible mandate allows it to dynamically manage its market and currency exposure to protect clients' capital and to enhance the long-term returns of our investments.

### MONTHLY SUMMARY

CI Munro Alternative Global Growth Fund Class F (the Fund) returned 1.2% over the month of October, comprising a return of 1.2% from equities and 0.0% from currency exchange. Meanwhile, the Fund's benchmark, the MSCI All Country World Total Return Index, detracted -2.6% (in Canadian dollar terms), with a -2.5% move in equities and a -0.1% return from currency exchange. The Scotiabank Alternative Mutual Fund Index returned -0.6%.

The Fund's long positions added 0.2%, while shorts and hedging added 1.0%. Markets were volatile in October as investors awaited the U.S. election and watched with caution as the virus situation deteriorated in the U.S. and Europe.

Key contributors included Chinese tech companies Tencent and Alibaba, U.S. health care companies Thermo Fisher and Danaher (involved in COVID-19 testing and vaccine development) and Danish renewables developer Orsted.

We see a Biden presidency and a divided congress as positive for U.S. equities as it likely means limited tax changes and more moderate fiscal stimulus, allowing rates to stay low. With this backdrop, we remain positive on equities.

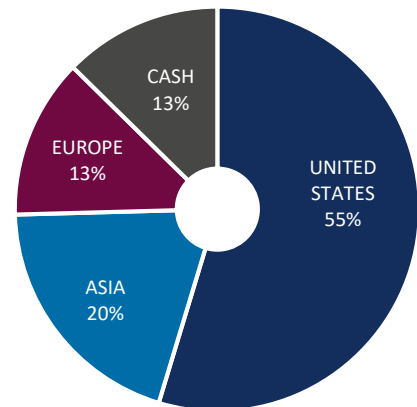
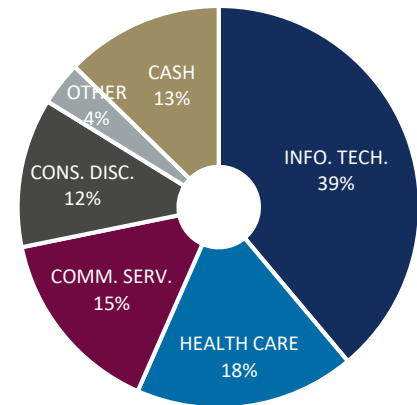

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## GLOSSARY OF TERMS

**Standard Deviation:** Standard deviation is widely used to measure risk in terms of the volatility of returns. It represents the historical level of volatility in returns over set periods. A lower standard deviation means the returns have historically been less volatile and vice versa. Historical volatility may not be indicative of future volatility.

**Beta:** A measure of the volatility, or systematic risk, of a security or a portfolio in comparison to the market as a whole.
