

# Sentry Small/Mid Cap Income Class

Management Report of Fund Performance for the period ended September 30, 2019

## RESULTS OF OPERATIONS

The net asset value of the Sentry Small/Mid Cap Income Class (the Fund) decreased by \$33.0 million to \$125.0 million from March 31, 2019 to September 30, 2019. The Fund had net redemptions of \$33.7 million during the period. The portfolio's performance increased assets by \$2.6 million. The Fund paid distributions totalling \$1.9 million. Series A shares returned 1.7% after fees and expenses for the six-month period ended September 30, 2019. Over the same time period, the Fund's benchmark returned 2.8%. The benchmark is a combination of the S&P/TSX Completion Total Return Index - 70% and the S&P MidCap 400 Total Return Index - 30%.

The performance of the Fund's other Series is substantially similar to that of Series A shares, except for differences in the structure of fees and expenses. For the returns of the Fund's other Series, please refer to the "Past Performance" section.

The following commentary pertains to the results of operations of the Sentry Small/Mid Cap Income Fund (the Underlying Fund).

The U.S. Federal Reserve cut interest rates twice during the period, in both July and September 2019. Global trade tensions continued to escalate, notably between the United States and China. Global uncertainty resulted in a reduction of capital expenditures by global corporations, the effect of which was felt throughout the global economy.

The Underlying Fund underperformed its benchmark for the period. Security selection within the health care and consumer discretionary sectors contributed to the Underlying Fund's performance. Individual contributors to performance included holdings in Real Matters Inc. and Cargojet Inc. Real Matters, which develops and provides technology and network management solutions to mortgage lending and insurance industries in Canada and the United States, reported stronger than expected earnings gains. Cargojet provides time-sensitive overnight air cargo services in Canada. During the period, it entered into an agreement with Amazon.com Inc. to fortify its existing commercial relationship, which drove its share price up.

Security selection within the industrials and real estate sectors detracted from performance. Individual detractors from performance included holdings in Enerflex Ltd. and Great Canadian Gaming Corp. Enerflex supplies natural gas compression, oil and gas processing, refrigeration systems and electric power generation equipment to the oil and natural gas industry. Its share price fell following a decline in customer bookings and backlog levels. Great Canadian Gaming operates gaming properties in Canada and the United States, including casinos, horse racetrack casinos, community gaming centre and commercial bingo halls. Its results in Ontario and British Columbia were weak during the period.

We added a new position in Trisura Group Ltd., a specialty insurance business with a presence in Canada and the United States. We like the company's underwriting strength and growth prospects, and believe that its current share price does not reflect this favorable outlook. We increased an existing holding in SLM Corp., a holding company that operates as a saving, planning and paying for college company in the United States. We believe that the company is substantially undervalued relative to its returns on equity and long-term growth prospects.

International Game Technology provides gaming systems and lottery services in Europe and North America. While we like the company's long-term contracts, we became less confident about its ability to grow and had some concerns around its debt levels. The holding was eliminated, the proceeds deployed into more attractive investment opportunities. Axalta Coating Systems Ltd., a global provider of coatings for refinish and industrial applications was trimmed to take profits after the company initiated a strategic review that caused significant appreciation in its share price.

## RECENT DEVELOPMENTS

We expect global growth will continue to slow in the coming period. Escalating trade tensions and broad-based economic uncertainty should continue to be a challenge to global growth. We remain disciplined in our investment selection, focused on companies that have strong free cash flow generation and low debt levels.

Effective September 19, 2019, James McPhedran became a member of the Independent Review Committee (IRC) of CI Funds and effective August 15, 2019, John Reucassel resigned as a member of the IRC of CI Funds.

## RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

### **Manager and Portfolio Advisor**

CI Investments Inc. is the Manager and Portfolio Advisor of the Fund. CI Investments Inc. is a subsidiary of CI Financial Corp. The Manager, in consideration for management fees, provides management services required in the day-to-day operations of the Fund. The Manager bears all of the operating expenses of the Fund (other than borrowing and interest costs, investor meeting costs (as permitted by Canadian securities regulation), the fees and expenses of the Independent Review Committee, the fees, costs and expenses associated with compliance with any new governmental and regulatory requirements imposed on or after February 16, 2018 and new governmental fees or with any changes to existing governmental and regulatory requirements imposed on or after February 16, 2018 (including increases to regulatory filing fees), any new types of costs, expenses or fees not incurred prior to February 16, 2018, including those arising from new government or regulatory requirements or related to those external services that were not commonly charged in the Canadian mutual fund industry as of February 16, 2018, and

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operating expenses that were or are outside the normal course of business of the Fund on or after February 16, 2018) in return for an administration fee.

The Manager received \$1.0 million in management fees and \$0.1 million in administration fees for the period.

## Management Fees

Approximately 26% of total management fees were used to pay for sales and trailing commissions. The remaining 74% of management fees were used to pay for investment management and other general administration.

## Independent Review Committee

The Fund received standing instructions from the Fund's IRC with respect to the following related party transactions:

- a) trades in securities of CI Financial Corp.; and
- b) purchases or sales of securities of an issuer from or to another investment fund managed by the Manager.

The applicable standing instructions require that related party transactions be conducted in accordance with the Manager's policies and procedures and that the Manager advise the IRC of any material breach of a condition of the standing instructions. The standing instructions require, among other things, that investment decisions in respect of related party transactions (a) are free from any influence by an entity related to the Manager and without taking into account any consideration relevant to an entity related to the Manager; (b) represent the business judgment of the Manager uninfluenced by considerations other than the best interests of the Fund; (c) are made in compliance with the Manager's policies and procedures; and (d) achieve a fair and reasonable result for the Fund. Transactions made by the Manager under the standing instructions are subsequently reviewed by the IRC on a quarterly basis to monitor compliance.

The Fund relied on the IRC's standing instructions regarding related party transactions during this reporting period.

Except as otherwise noted above, the Fund was not a party to any related party transactions during the period ended September 30, 2019.

The Effective HST tax rate is calculated using the attribution percentage for each province based on shareholder residency and can be different from 13%.

(3) The trading expense ratio represents total commissions and other portfolio transaction costs expressed as an annualized percentage of daily average net assets during the period, including the Fund's proportionate share of such expenses of any underlying fund(s), if applicable.

(4) The Fund's portfolio turnover rate indicates how actively the Fund's portfolio advisor manages its portfolio investments. A portfolio turnover rate of 100% is equivalent to the Fund buying and selling all of the securities in its portfolio once in the course of the fiscal period. The higher a Fund's portfolio turnover rate in a period, the greater the trading costs payable by the Fund in the period, and the greater the chance of an investor receiving taxable capital gains in the period. There is not necessarily a relationship between a higher turnover rate and the performance of a Fund. Portfolio turnover rate is calculated by dividing the lesser of the cost of purchases and the proceeds of sales of portfolio securities for the period, and excluding cash and short-term investments maturing in less than one year, and before assets acquired from a merger, if applicable, by the average of the monthly fair value of investments during the period.

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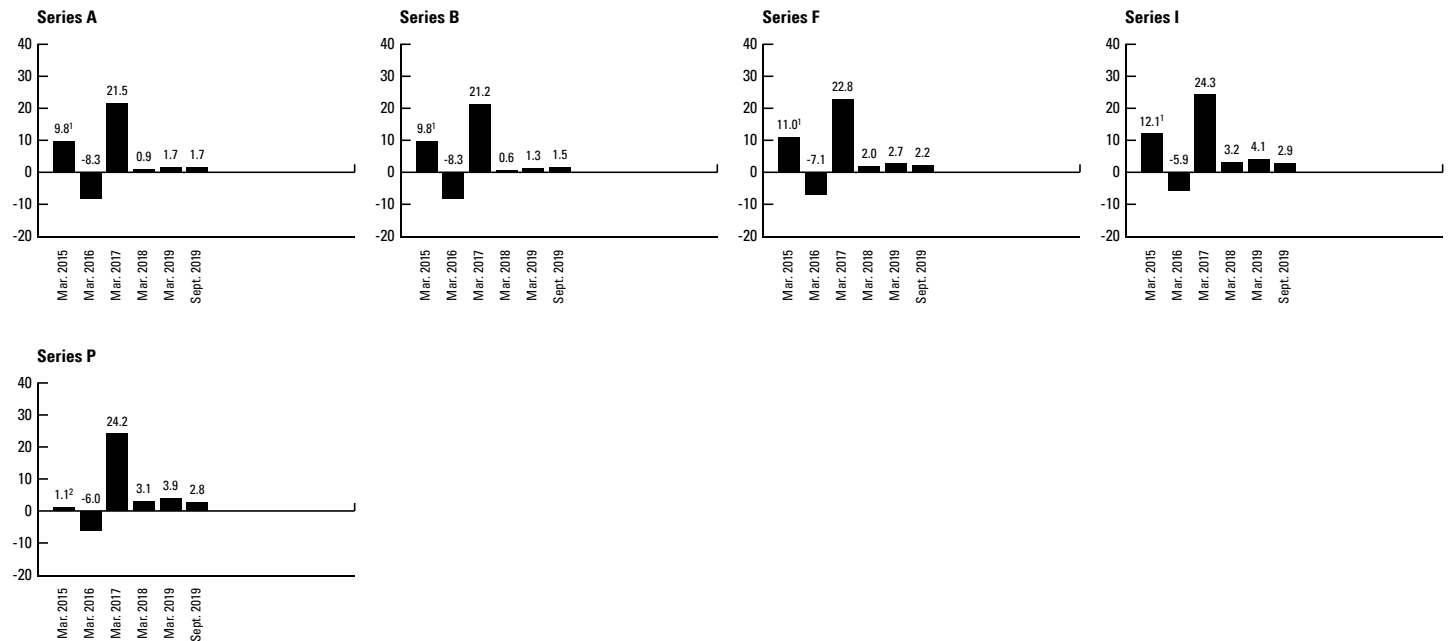
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## PAST PERFORMANCE
