Management Report of Fund Performance for the period ended September 30, 2020

## RESULTS OF OPERATIONS

The Fund's net assets increased by \$78.4 million to \$388.6 million from March 31, 2020 to September 30, 2020. The Fund had net redemptions of \$44.8 million during the period. The portfolio's performance increased assets by \$123.2 million. Series A units returned 40.9% after fees and expenses for the six-month period ended September 30, 2020. Over the same time period, the Fund's benchmark returned 26.7%. The benchmark is the MSCI World Small Cap Total Return Index (the Benchmark).

The performance of the Fund's other Series is substantially similar to that of Series A units, except for differences in the structure of fees and expenses. For the returns of the Fund's other Series, please refer to the "Past Performance" section.

The following commentary pertains to the results of operations of the Cambridge Growth Companies Corporate Class (the Underlying Fund).

While COVID-19's global spread does not fall under the conventional definition of a "macroeconomic" event, it nonetheless was the greatest such event since the Great Depression. In a matter of weeks, unemployment went from record lows of 3.5% to 14.7%. This led us to conduct thorough reviews of our portfolio holdings to ensure we had a margin of safety in light of these events. In most cases we saw only a temporary impact to fundamentals, while in a handful of companies their fundamentals improved, especially our holdings oriented to the digital economy. There were also two examples of businesses in the travel industry that were directly affected by COVID-19, where we saw an ongoing impact. We adjusted our position size in the case of one and exited the position altogether for the other.

While this type of operating environment requires greater agility and flexibility on the application of our process, the underlying process remains consistent. We continue to seek quality business that we believe have favourable future prospects, a process we believe will result in strong risk-adjusted returns for our investors. We are pleased with the resilience demonstrated by the underlying holdings in the portfolio and thus the portfolio as a whole. We believe we are through the worst of the uncertainty and our decision to avoid bad balance sheets and companies at the eye of the COVID-19 storm has served clients well. As we exit this uncertainty it will not be smooth, and thus our focus remains on cash-generative, well-capitalized companies in growing end markets that are taking market share.

The Underlying Fund outperformed its benchmark for the period. Stock selection was the main driver of Underlying Fund performance, particularly in the industrials and consumer discretionary sectors. The top individual contributors to performance included Etsy Inc., RH and Ama Group Ltd. Etsy, an e-commerce service provider, continues to be a strong addition to the portfolio since being added late last year. It continues to reinvest in supporting sellers on the platform, as well as overall brand marketing to raise awareness.

Etsy has also made great strides to add millions of new users to the platform over the last few months as it capitalizes on increased site traffic. Restoration Hardware (RH) is a leading retailer of high-end furniture (70% of revenues) and home furnishings (30%). The company has a strong established brand and continues to demonstrate an increase in compounded revenue. The management team is focused on the long-term goal of building a \$20-billion brand. In September, the company reported strong product demand, leading to much-improved profitability. RH is led by a long-time visionary CEO who we believe has the ability to navigate the challenging retail market given COVID-19. Ama Group acquires, develops and operates business in the automotive aftercare market. The company has performed better than expected as activity levels and volumes are rebounding. The initial fears surrounding the company's balance sheet have dissipated as it is in incrementally better shape than feared.

The Underlying Fund's holdings in the materials and communication services sectors detracted from performance. The largest individual detractors from performance included CarGurus Inc., Kusuri no Aoki Holdings Co. Ltd. and Medpace Holdings Inc. CarGurus, which offers new and used vehicles, is the fastest-growing automotive shopping site in the United Kingdom. The company has experienced a difficult period and we continue to monitor the risk/reward of this holding. Kusuri no Aoki Holdings operate food and drug stores in Japan that provide medicines, cosmetics, health foods, beauty care and household products. The company offers a differentiated business model, combining fresh food with drug store items in a convenient format. It has plenty of growth potential, and is led by a strong management team. Shares have lagged following a period as a safe-haven investment during the initial pandemic. Medpace provides outside clinical development services in the areas of cardiovascular, hematology, oncology, neurology, pediatrics, nephrology and other diagnostic services. The company has performed well and issued strong full year guidance during the period.

Over the period, we added new positions in LivePerson Inc. and Electrocomponents PLC, and eliminated the Underlying Fund's holding in Knight-Swift Transportation Holdings Inc.

Then Fund outperformed its benchmark for the period.

## RECENT DEVELOPMENTS

We are beginning to see economic activity level off as consumer-facing businesses face renewed challenges, resulting in further layoffs. Industrial activity should continue to expand as companies come back online and seek to rebuild inventories. The U.S. election will likely result in greater market volatility as policy impacts from either party are reassessed. Technology and work-from-home industries should continue to experience demand as shortages have extended the buying cycle for those goods. Company valuations, however, have returned to prior speculative highs in many cases and pose a risk should sentiment move elsewhere. While this type of operating environment requires greater agility and flexibility on the application of our process, the underlying

## RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

### Manager, Portfolio Advisor, Trustee and Registrar

CI Investments Inc. is the Manager, Portfolio Advisor, Trustee and Registrar of the Fund. CI Investments Inc. is a subsidiary of CI Financial Corp. The Manager, in consideration for management fees, provides management services required in the day-to-day operations of the Fund. The Manager bears all of the operating expenses of the Fund (other than taxes, borrowing costs and new governmental fees) in return for an administration fee.

The Manager received \$3.3 million in management fees and \$0.4 million in administration fees for the period.

### Management Fees

Approximately 26% of total management fees were used to pay for sales and trailing commissions. The remaining 74% of management fees were used to pay for investment management and other general administration.

### Related Fund Trading

Related fund trading occurs when a Fund purchases or sells units/shares of another Fund managed by the Manager. During the period ended September 30, 2020, the Fund engaged in related fund trading or held position(s) in related fund(s) at the end of the period.

### Independent Review Committee

The Fund has standing instructions from the Fund's IRC with respect to the following related party transactions:

- trades in securities of CI Financial Corp.; and
- purchases or sales of securities of an issuer from or to another investment fund managed by the Manager.

The applicable standing instructions require, amongst others, that related party transactions be conducted in accordance with the Manager's policies and procedures and applicable law and that the Manager advise the IRC of any material breach of such policies. The standing instructions also require that investment decisions in respect of related party transactions (a) are free from any influence by an entity related to the Manager and without taking into account any consideration relevant to an entity related to the Manager; (b) represent the business judgment of the Manager uninfluenced by considerations other than the best interests of the Fund; (c) are made in compliance with the Manager's policies and procedures; and (d) achieve a fair and reasonable result for the Fund. Transactions made by the Manager under the standing instructions are subsequently reviewed by the IRC on a quarterly basis to monitor compliance.

The Fund relied on the IRC's standing instructions regarding related party transactions during this reporting period.

Except as otherwise noted above, the Fund was not a party to any related party transactions during the period ended September 30, 2020.

The higher a Fund's portfolio turnover rate in a period, the greater the trading costs payable by the Fund in the period, and the greater the chance of an investor receiving taxable capital gains in the period. There is not necessarily a relationship between a higher turnover rate and the performance of a Fund. Portfolio turnover rate is calculated by dividing the lesser of the cost of purchases and the proceeds of sales of portfolio securities for the period, and excluding cash and short-term investments maturing in less than one year, and before assets acquired from a merger, if applicable, by the average of the monthly fair value of investments during the period.

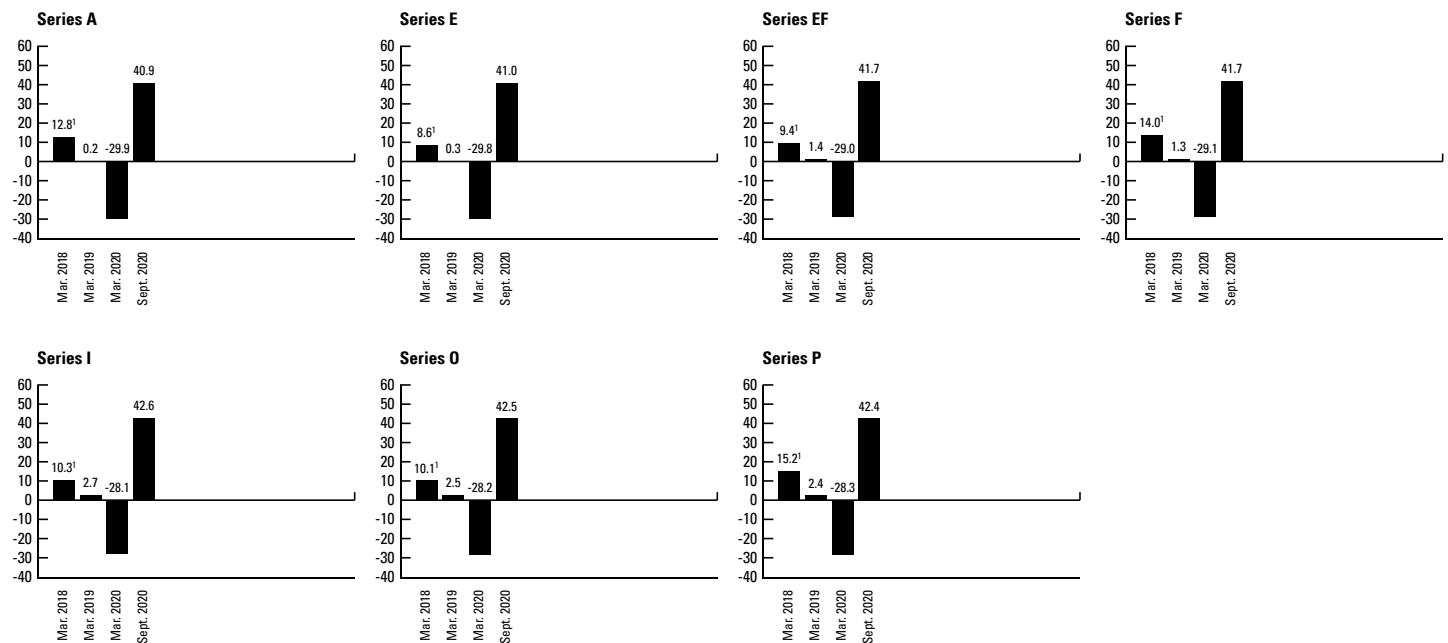

## PAST PERFORMANCE
