Management Report of Fund Performance for the period/year ended September 30, 2023

This semi-annual management report of fund performance contains financial highlights but does not contain the complete semi-annual or annual financial statements of the investment fund. RESULTS OF OPERATIONS

The Fund's net assets decreased by \$0.7 million to \$22.0 million from March 31, 2023 to September 30, 2023. The Fund had net redemptions of \$0.2 million during the period. The portfolio's performance decreased assets by \$0.5 million. Series A units returned -2.9% after fees and expenses for the six-month period ended September 30, 2023. Over the same time period, the Fund's benchmark returned -0.5%. The benchmark is the MSCI EAFE Total Return Index (the Benchmark or the Index).

The performance of the Fund's other Series is substantially similar to that of Series A units, except for differences in the structure of fees and expenses. For the returns of the Fund's other Series, please refer to the "Past Performance" section.

During the period, economic activity slowed in response to rising interest rates and geopolitical conflict. Higher levels of inflation persisted. Economic growth in China was slower than expected.

The Fund underperformed its benchmark for the period. Slowing sales volumes detracted from the Fund's performance as economic activity slowed. The impact of higher interest rates and inflation on corporate margins also detracted from the performance of the Fund's holdings. The largest individual detractors from the Fund's performance included holdings in Norsk Hydro ASA, which saw slowing sales revenue, and Keyence Corp., which saw slowing orders for automation devices.

Exposure to the health care sector contributed to the Fund's performance, as did its currency positioning. Top individual contributors to the Fund's performance included holdings in Disco Corp., Shell PLC and Novo Nordisk AS. Disco Corp. continued to see good demand for its microchip-making capabilities. Shell PLC's stock rose amid higher energy prices, which led to greater profitability. Novo Nordisk AS benefited from continued demand for its diabetes and weight loss drugs.

The impact of slower-than-expected growth in China had a negative influence on many European companies. We added a new position in Ipsen SA based on the stability of the company's drug development pipeline. An existing position in SAP SE was increased based on the stability of the company's consulting and software services. A position in Svenska Handelsbanken AB was eliminated as we consolidated positions within the Fund's banking holdings. The Fund's position in LVMH Moët Hennessy Louis Vuitton SE was trimmed as the company has been negatively impacted by China's growth issues.

RECENT DEVELOPMENTS

We believe that volatility in financial markets will continue amid higher interest rates and geopolitical unrest. As such, the Fund remains biased towards high-quality businesses.

RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

Manager, Portfolio Adviser, Trustee and Registrar

CI Investments Inc. is the Manager, Portfolio Adviser, Trustee and Registrar of the Fund. CI Investments Inc. is a subsidiary of CI Financial Corp. The Manager, in consideration for management fees, provides management services required in the day-to-day operations of the Fund. The Manager bears all of the operating expenses of the Fund (other than taxes, borrowing costs and new governmental fees) in return for an administration fee.

The Manager received \$0.02 million in management fees and a nominal amount in administration fees for the period.

Management Fees

Approximately 26% of total management fees were used to pay for sales and trailing commissions. The remaining 74% of management fees were used to pay for investment management and other general administration.

Portfolio Sub-Advisor

CI Global Investments Inc., an affiliate of CI Investments Inc., provides investment advice to the Fund.

Inter Fund Trading

Inter fund trading occurs when a Fund purchases or sells a security of any issuer from or to another Fund managed by the Manager. These transactions are executed through market intermediaries and under prevailing market terms and conditions. The Independent Review Committee (IRC) reviews such transactions during scheduled meetings. During the period/year ended September 30, 2023, the Fund executed inter fund trades.

Independent Review Committee

The Manager, in respect of the Fund, received the following standing instructions from the IRC with respect to related party transactions:

The applicable standing instructions require, amongst others, that related party transactions be conducted in accordance with the Manager's policies and procedures and applicable law and that the Manager reports related party transactions periodically to the IRC and advise the IRC of any material breach of such policies. The Manager's policies and procedures require that investment decisions in respect of related party transactions (a) are free from any influence by an entity related to the Manager and without taking into account any consideration relevant to an entity related to the Manager; (b) represent the business judgment of the Manager, uninfluenced by considerations other than the best interests of the Fund; (c) do not exceed the limitations of the applicable legislation; and (d) achieve a fair and reasonable result for the Fund.

Except as otherwise noted above under Related Party Transactions section, the Fund was not a party to any related party transactions during the period/year ended September 30, 2023. If the Fund invested in related party transactions, it relied on the IRC's standing instructions regarding related party transactions during this reporting period/year.

(2) Management expense ratio is calculated based on expenses charged to the Fund (excluding commissions and other portfolio transaction costs) and is expressed as an annualized percentage of daily average net assets for the period/year, including the Fund's proportionate share of any underlying fund(s) expenses, if applicable. The Effective HST tax rate is calculated using the attribution percentage for each province based on unitholder residency and can be different from 13%.

(3) The trading expense ratio represents total commissions and other portfolio transaction costs expressed as an annualized percentage of daily average net assets during the period/year, including the Fund's proportionate share of such expenses of any underlying fund(s), if applicable.

(4) The Fund's portfolio turnover rate indicates how actively the Fund's portfolio advisor manages its portfolio investments. A portfolio turnover rate of 100% is equivalent to the Fund buying and selling all of the securities in its portfolio once in the course of the fiscal period/year. The higher a Fund's portfolio turnover rate in a period/year, the greater the trading costs payable by the Fund in the period/year, and the greater the chance of an investor receiving taxable capital gains in the period/year. There is not necessarily a relationship between a higher turnover rate and the performance of a Fund. Portfolio turnover rate is calculated by dividing the lesser of the cost of purchases and the proceeds of sales of portfolio securities for the period/year, and excluding cash and short-term investments maturing in less than one year, and before assets acquired from a merger, if applicable, by the average of the monthly fair value of investments during the period/year.

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
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PAST PERFORMANCE
